



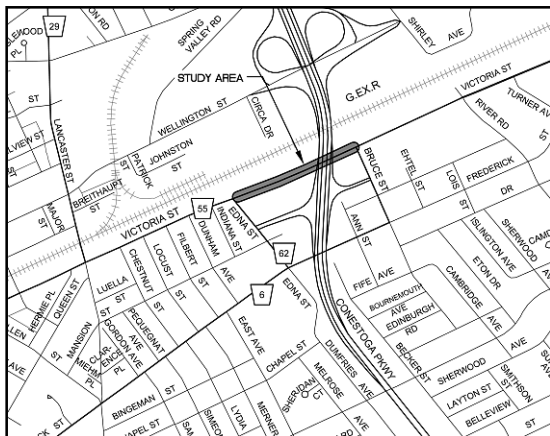
NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT SCHEDULE B CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

VICTORIA STREET IMPROVEMENTS EDNA STREET TO BRUCE STREET, CITY OF KITCHENER

The Regional Municipality of Waterloo is undertaking a study to address infrastructure improvements on Victoria Street from Edna Street to Bruce Street in the City of Kitchener. This study is being carried out under Schedule B of the Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process and will look at various alternatives for road improvements.

The study will investigate alternative lane and/or median configurations to improve safety and reduce mid-block traffic collisions. The study will also consider potential improvements for access to local businesses and pedestrian facility upgrades, along with any required improvements to the condition of existing pavement and underground services within the project limits.

Construction is proposed to commence in 2014, subject to the findings of this study and receipt of necessary approvals. Public input and comments are invited for incorporation into the planning and design of this project at any time during the Class EA process.
